# Overview of the Public Assistance (PA) Program

There are two types of work: Emergency and Permanent

#### **Emergency Work**

Deadline to complete Emergency Work is 6 months from the declaration date

Within its discretion, FDEM may grant a time extension for Emergency Work by 6 months 44 CFR §206.204 Address an immediate threat:

- A Debris removal
- B Emergency protective measures

#### **Permanent Work**

Restoration of:

- C Roads/bridges
- D Water control facilities
- **E** Buildings/equipment
- **F** Utilities
- G Parks, recreational, and other facilities

\*Other facilities may also include Temporary Facilities when a continuity of services are provided by eligible Applicants within that facility

Deadline to complete Permanent Work is 18 months from the declaration date

Within its discretion, FDEM may grant a time extension of up to 30 months for Permanent Work on a project by project basis 44 CFR §206.204



# Overview of the Public Assistance (PA) Program

#### • Are you an eligible Applicant for Public Assistance?

- 1. Are you an Eligible Applicant?
  - State and Territorial Governments
  - Indian Tribal Governments
  - Local Governments and Special Districts
  - Private nonprofits (PNPs)

- 3. Are you Performing any Eligible Task?
  - Result of declared incident
  - Within designated area
  - Legal responsibility

- 2. Do you have an Eligible Facility?
  - Public facility
  - Private nonprofit facility
  - Mixed-use facility
  - Small Business Administration loan requirement
  - Facility under the specific authority of other Federal Agencies
  - Inactive or partially inactive facility
  - Facility scheduled for repair or replacement
- 4. Are the Costs Eligible?
  - Directly tied to the performance of eligible work
  - Adequately documented
  - Duplication of benefits
  - Non-prohibited work
  - Consistent with Applicant's policies
  - Necessary and reasonable



#### Recent Changes

- Expedited Projects
- Funding Agreement (FA) Changes
- Pre-obligation Validation Changes
- 428 vs Traditional Program and 406 Mitigation with each



- Expedited Project Criteria
  - Funding
    - 50% of actual costs incurred through an eligible scope of work using sound estimating methodology for Category A and B Large Projects during the first 45-90 days (determined on severity) following the disaster
    - FEMA will obligate 50% of the costs reflected on the Expedited PW




- Expedited Project Criteria cont.
  - Disclaimer
    - Upon obligation of Version 0 for <u>all Expedited Projects</u>, FEMA will immediately begin Version 1 development and the Applicant will be required to provide full documentation
    - Ultimately all projects and related costs will be subject to full and complete validation



- Funding Agreement Changes
  - Applicants will enter into a Funding Agreement during the project development phase
  - For Hurricane Michael and future storms, amendments for each additional project will not be required



Funding Agreement Workflow





- Pre-obligation Validation Changes
  - For all post 2016 Presidentially Declared disasters
    - Project costs will be 20% validated at the FEMA level and 30% validated at FDEM's level, for a total of 50% project cost validation
    - Small Projects for both Emergency and Permanent Work will not undergo additional validation once obligated by FEMA
    - Completed Large Projects
      - 20% FEMA validation and 30% FDEM validation, for a total of 50% cost validation
      - Once obligated, FDEM will help the Applicant request 50% reimbursement on costs
      - FDEM will also assist the Applicant in requesting any additional funds
    - Uncompleted Projects will not be validated by FDEM prior to obligation, but will be once actual costs are demonstrated



- FEMA 428 vs Traditional Program
- Section 428 of the Stafford Act
  - Allows for Strategic Funds Management
  - Environmental and Historical rules are not as strict
  - Waiver of FSS for funds to be "on-hand"
- Section 406 Mitigation
  - Underutilized
  - Mitigation included in your project
  - Does not count against Hazard Mitigation Grant Program projects
  - Enhances the HMGP allocation
